Click on the link above and listen to the story again to recap the language used in the text. You can follow the WAGOLL using the typed version at the bottom of this document if you wish. 2. Have a look at the plot of the tale, can you see how different events occur throughout the story? When you are planning your story, try and make the plot follow a similar pattern.
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Have another read of the text and see if you can identify the different events.

- Using the box up template at the bottom of the document, have a go at boxing up your own version of this tale. You can type this or write your ideas on a piece of paper.

There is also an example of a box up to give you some ideas!

- Recap your box up plan and write down some key words that you think you would like to use. Make sure they are spelt correctly!

Don't forget to include expanded noun phrases, fronted adverbials and similes. You should write in the past tense.

- Write the first paragraph of your story. Check, have you used a comma after a fronted adverbial? Have you used a comma/and to separate your adjectives? Does it make sense?

If you want to challenge yourself further, have a go at writing paragraph two.

Boxing up



- ★ The King of the Fishes is a wishing tale.
- ★ Let's look at the underlying pattern of the story by putting each section of the plot into a separate box. Later, we can use this to help us plan a new story.

A typical wishing tale will follow this type of plot:

Main character (MC) really wants something
MC tries to get what they want
A barrier gets in the way
MC overcomes the barrier
MC gets what they wished for
Sometimes all is well – sometimes not!

This week's challenge is to read 'Cornflake coin.' You will find it in the 7 - 9 years old section of the website above. Before starting the book please encourage your child to use the front cover and blurb to predict what they think will happen in the story. Ask them why they think this and what there is on the cover/blurb to support their ideas?

Throughout the book, they may come across unfamiliar vocabulary, please take the opportunity to research the definition of these words together, preferably using a dictionary but if you do not have access to a dictionary, then look the words up online. At school the children

have been developing their dictionary skills by finding the first 3 letters to begin with and identifying the word from there. It would be helpful if you could support your children to do this.

Question: What other treasures might be in the ground where Kerry found the coin?
What does it say on the first coin that Kerry finds?
